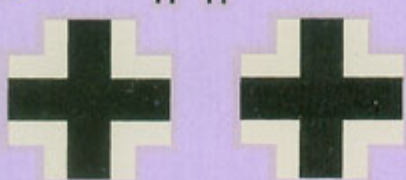
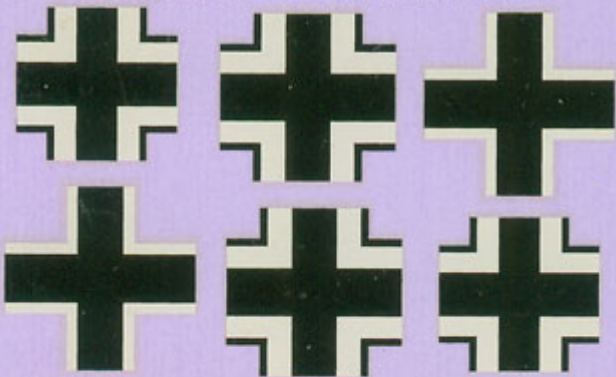
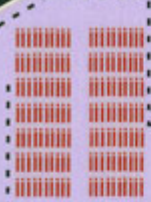

FW 190A-2, W.Nr. 289165, 12.JG5, airframe Herda, Norway, Lieutenant Karl-Helm Koch. It is brought down and was lost in this plane on February, 04 1945.

The plane had a camouflage from above large fields in two colors - RLM74 and RLM75 with a bottom and on each side a fuselage - RLM76. Small stencils are absent. The each of the screws - a spiral of dark blue color, a strip on a cowd - blue. A wheel feather - white.



FW 190A-2, W.Nr.0032, commander III./JG26, Hptm. Josef Priller, airframe Veebeljein, August 1942.

Standard camouflage RLM74/75/76 with small stencils RLM75/74 on each side a fuselage. The bottom part of a cowd and a direction wheel - yellow. An element onboard a fuselage - black.



FW 190A-3 commander I./JG51, Hptm Heinrich Kraft, Essen, East Prussia, August 1943.

Standard camouflage RLM74/75/76 with small stencils RLM75/75 on each side a fuselage. An emblem of group and a sign on the commander of group it is located on both parties of a fuselage. The each of the screws - black.



FW 190A-4, 12./JG11, Denmark, Spring 1945.

Standard camouflage RLM74/75/76 with small stencils RLM75/75 on each side a fuselage. A cowd, forward parts of a fuselage (for deposit conventional), the each of the screws - black. A spiral on the cowd of the screws - white.



FW 190 A-3, the commander 14. Luftwaffe Hptm Friedrich-Wilhelm Strackelbach, Petsamo, northern Finland, 1943.

Standard camouflage RLM 74/75/76 without small stencils. The each of the screws - black.



FW 190 A-4 the commander I./JG24 Lieutenant Walter Nowatzky, Krassovogorodsk, November 1943.

The plane has been completely painted by a white enamel off paint. Half of cowd of the screws - white. A squadron and group emblem are located on the left and right party of a fuselage. The wings tips, with a strip round a fuselage and a cowd bottom - yellow.



FW 190A-4, W.Nr.745, the commander JG12 Hptm Siegfried Schaeff, airframe Vossen, February 1943.

Standard camouflage RLM 74/75/76 with small stencils RLM75 on each side a fuselage. The bottom part of a camouflage and a wheel of a direction of height - yellow, the each of the screws - black. A squadron emblem - only on cowd left hand side.



FW 190A-4, the pilot Peter Brossen, I./JG24, the Eagle, June 1943.

The plane has been painted in two shades green - RLM70 and RLM71, from below - RLM78. A group emblem practically on both parties of a fuselage, wings tips, the bottom part of a cowd and a direction wheel - yellow.



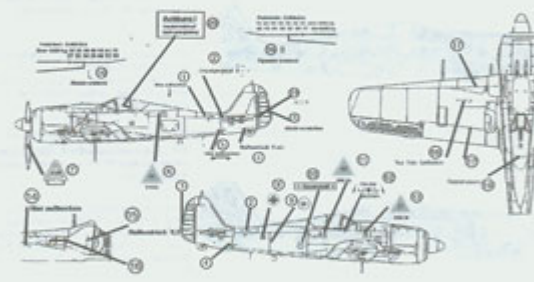
FW 190A-3, W.Nr.0135308, 14.JG5, Hptm Fridrik Strackelbach, on July, 7th 1943, Petsamo, Finland.

Camouflage from above the plane large stencils in two colors - RLM74/75, with a bottom, on each side a fuselage and a wheel feather - RLM76. Small stencils are absent. The each of the screws - half RLM76, other half - RLM75.



FW 190A-2, Fl. Horsthopf of Ag14 Parochin airfield (Germany) Summer 1944.

Standard camouflage RLM74/75/76. The each of the screws black, a spiral - white.
