Used for upper surfaces in 1938 standard French AF camouflage scheme (one of variants of recommended "brown" colour)

Gris Bleu Foncé
Used for upper surfaces in 1938 standard French Air Force camouflage scheme of all land-based aircraft

-  HTK-BO80
Vert
Used for upper surfaces in 1938 standard French AF camouflage scheme (one of variants of recommended "green" colour)
-  HTK-BO83
Gris Bleu Clair
Used for lower surfaces in 1938 standard French Air Force camouflage scheme of all land-based aircraft

-  HTK-BO81
Terre de Sienne
Used for upper surfaces in 1938 standard French AF camouflage scheme (one of variants of recommended "brown" colour)
-  HTK-BO84
Kaki Français
Used for upper surfaces in 1938 standard French AF camouflage scheme (one of variants of recommended "green" colour)

In December 1938 the French Air Ministry issued an instruction on camouflage of all land-based aircraft. Those already in service were painted during 1939, while the new ones received factory scheme. The colours applied could be different depending on the manufacturer - in general Light Blue Grey (Gris Bleu Clair) was used on lower surfaces, with a mix of Dark Blue Grey (Gris Bleu Foncé), green (usually Kaki Français) and brown (usually Brun Foncé or Terre de Sienne) used on upper surfaces.
